# What Does the GMO Do?

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- Administer, support & maintain the state's grant management system (eCivis) and related integrations
- Provide training and technical assistance on grant management best practices, guidance, rules & regulations
- U.S. Treasury reporting & compliance for major Pandemic related federal programs
- Provide services in grant management to agencies in state government
- Policy, procedure and regulations related to grant management ([220-RICR-20-00-2](#))
- Training and support for the subrecipient and applicant community
- Administer the State of RI SAM.gov account with all agencies under the umbrella and UEI's
- Facilitate the issuance, compliance and transparency parts of Designated Grants



# What is eCivis

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## Grants Management System (GMS)

- Tool that helps you manage the grant process from searching for funding opportunities all the way to closing out an awarded grant
- It can be used by the awarding state agency and subrecipient

## eCivis

- The GMS vendor that Rhode Island is contracted with
- eCivis is one of many different Grant Management Systems
- You may hear eCivis and GMS be used interchangeably



# Implementation and Adoption

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Implementation Start Date: August 2021 – December 2022

Adoption: January 2023

Full Effect: July 1, 2023 (State Grant Regulation)

GMO worked closely with state agencies to get their input to help shape the system we have today

eCivis is still work in progress – always looking for feedback – more enhancements on the way!

## Reasons Rhode Island Chose eCivis:

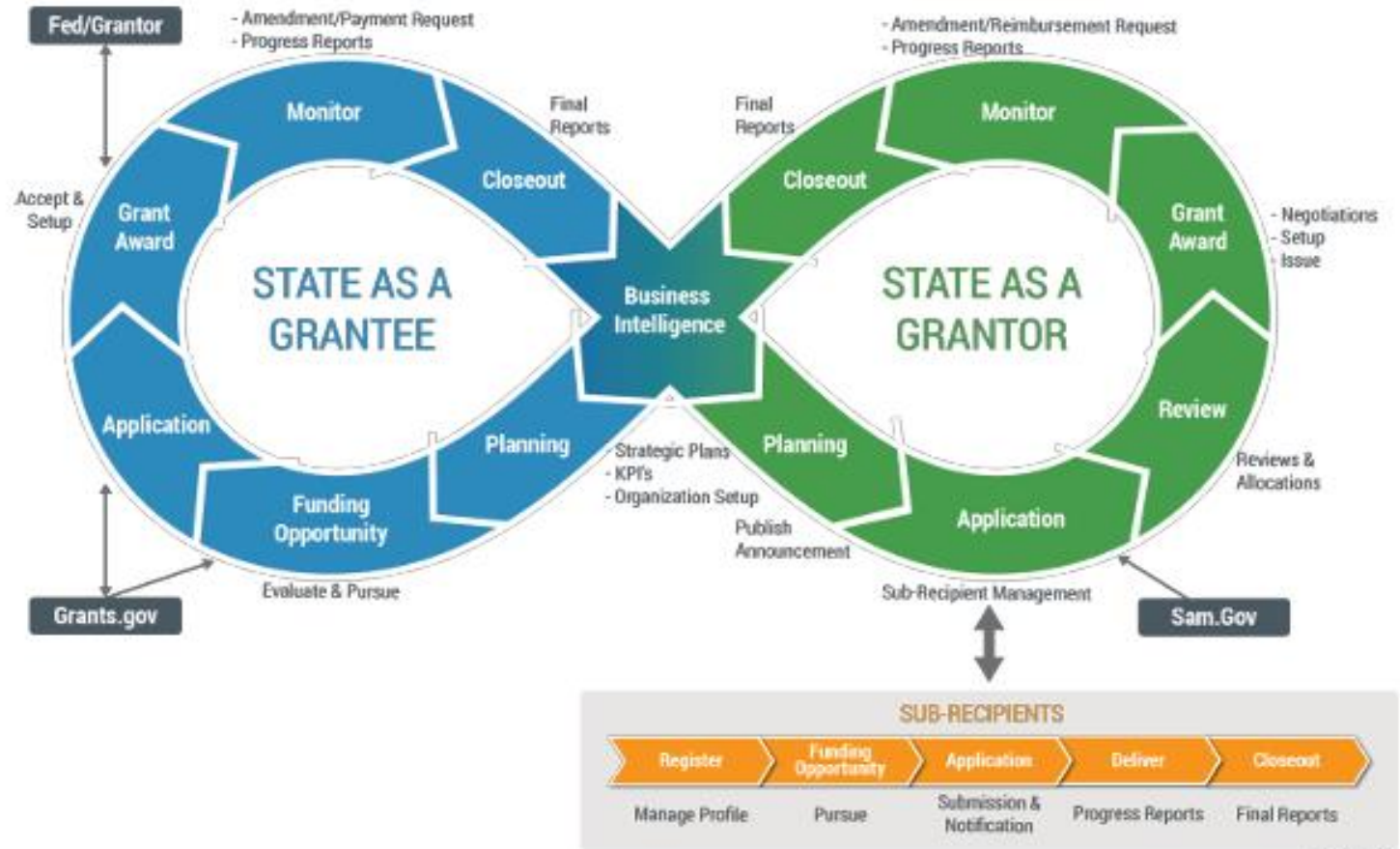
End to end GMS – both State as Grantee and State as Grantor

Allowed for a two-way integration with RIFANS (financial system)

Had experience with state-wide implementation

Other States using eCivis\*: Arizona, California, Georgia, Alaska, Missouri, Montana, New Jersey, Texas, Indiana

# Rhode Island Uses of eCivis

## State as Grantee (Prime Recipient Agency)

- Funding Opportunities
- Assign awarded grants
- Manage budget and track expenditures
- Set goals and metrics
- Assigning tasks
- Grant closeout

## State as Grantor (Pass-Through Entity)

- Create applications for subrecipients
- Issue subawards (competitive and non-competitive)
- Manage subrecipients and subawards
- Subrecipient reporting and invoicing
- Subrecipient Monitoring
- Subaward closeout

# State as Grantee (Prime Recipient Agency)

## Receiving money from the federal government and state agency expending the funds

- Utilizing the "Grantee side of the system"
  - Primarily the Search for Grants feature and Project Dashboard
- Recorded trainings to review
  - Funding Opportunities (How to find funding opportunities via eCivis for federal awards)
  - Standard Grantee (If your state agency receives federal funds)
  - Report Functionality (Users who will need to pull data from eCivis for reporting)



# State as Grantor (Pass Through Entity)

**Receiving money from the federal government and passing that money through the state agency to a subrecipient (State Agency may sometimes hold part of funds for agency use)**

- Utilizing the "Grantor side of the system"
  - Grant Management – Subrecipient Management (in eCivis)
  - What you enter in the Grantee side will influence the Grantor side
- Recorded Trainings to review
  - Avoiding Financial Pitfalls on Subaward Invoices (if you will be approving invoices)
  - Subaward Template Guidance and Drafting Appendix II to Subaward (If you will be initiating subaward agreements/making award recommendations)
  - Competitive Standard Grantor (if you will be creating a competitive application for a grant award)
  - Grantor Pre-Award (series of 5 videos for those managing competitive awards)
  - Grantor Post Award (If you will be managing subrecipients after they have been awarded)
  - Non-Competitive, Direct to Award (If you have been approved for a non-competitive applications)
  - Subrecipient Monitoring (3 part training for those responsible for subrecipient monitoring/post award management)

# Additional Training Topics

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- IAA-FF: Inter-Agency Agreement with Federal Funds
  - If your agency is passing federal money through to another state agency, or vice versa
- FFATA
  - If you have subrecipient awards of \$30,000 or more – mandatory reporting
- Grant Finance 101
  - General intro to grant finance for all
- RIFANS (State's financial system of record)
  - Basic functions of RIFANS as it related to grant finance and invoices

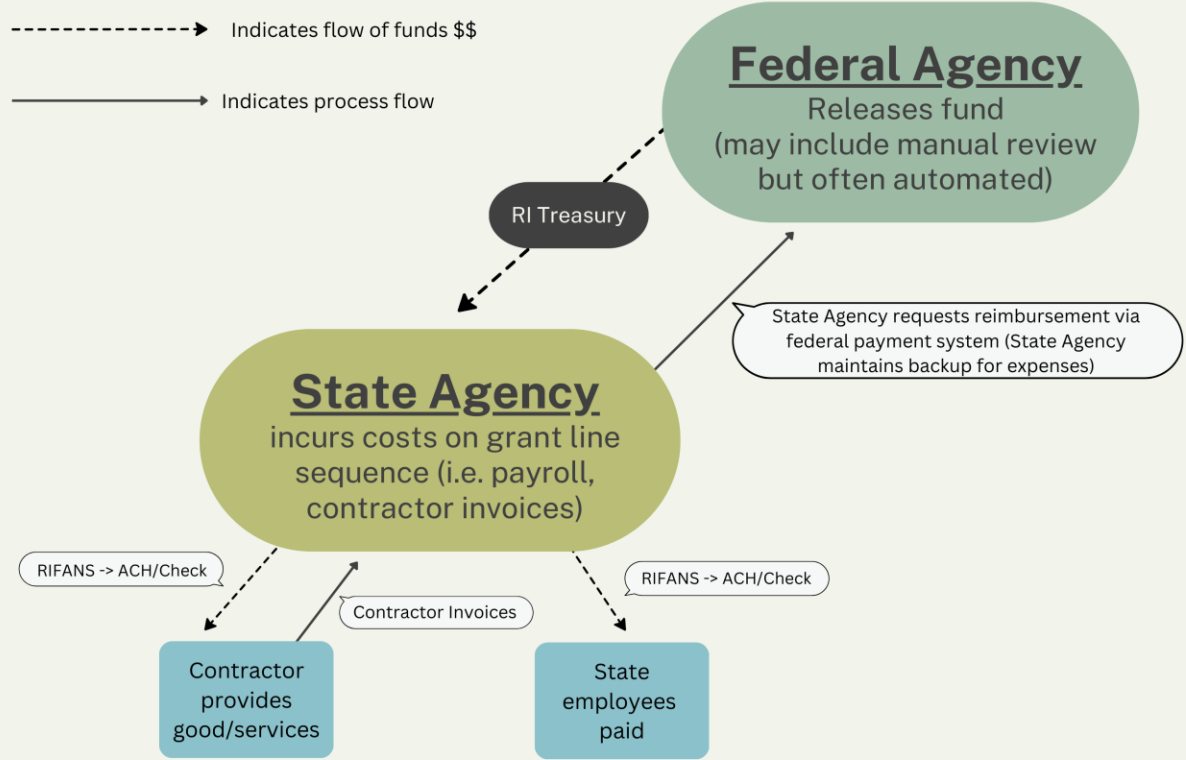

# Movement of Funds Flowcharts

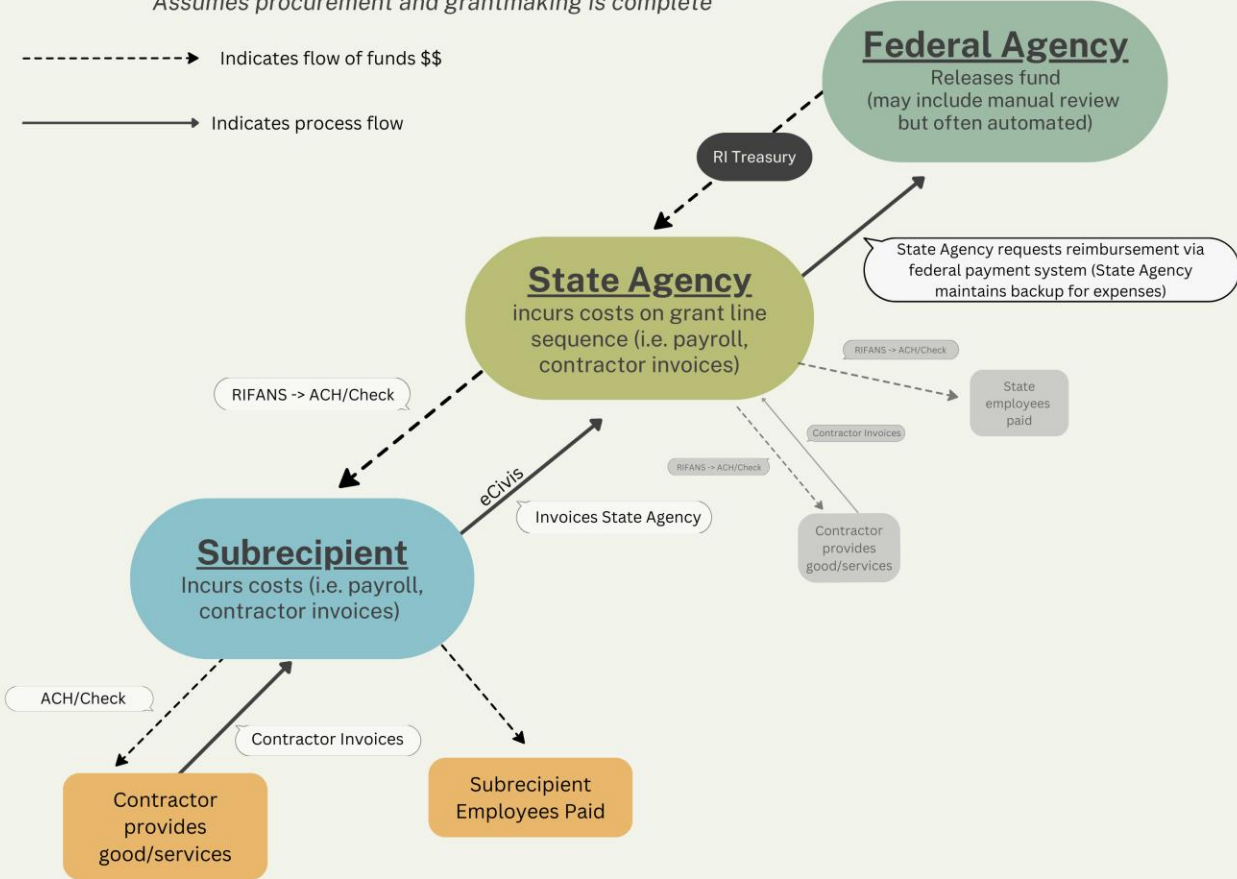
## Prime Recipient Financial Flow Chart

## Pass Through Entity Financial Flow Chart

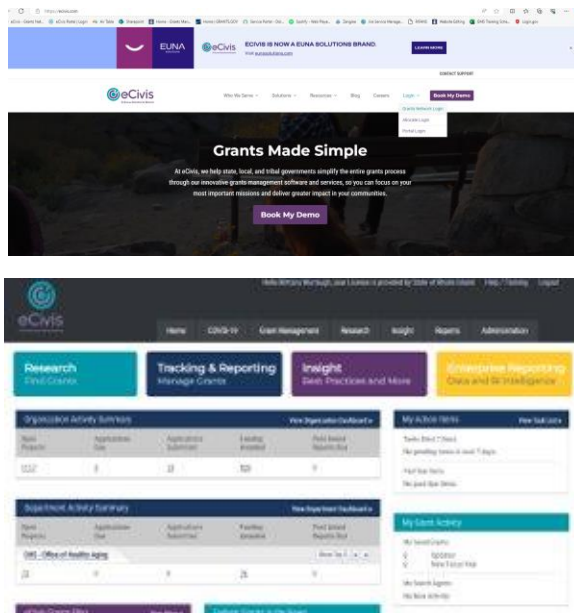
Assumes procurement and grantmaking is complete

## eCivis (Grants Network)

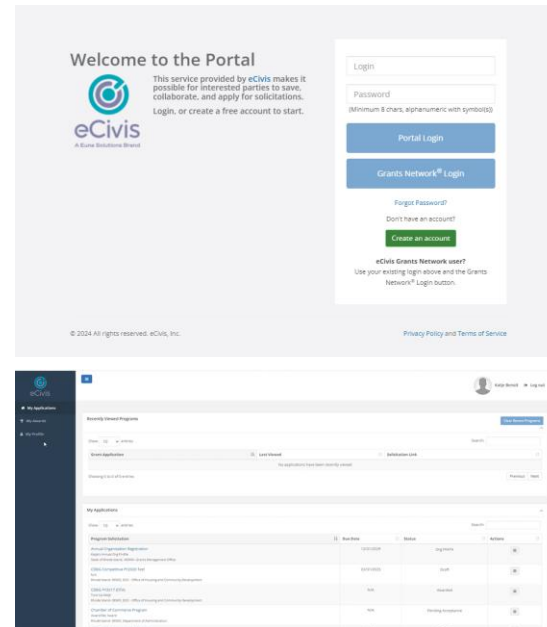
For State Agency users

## eCivis (Portal)

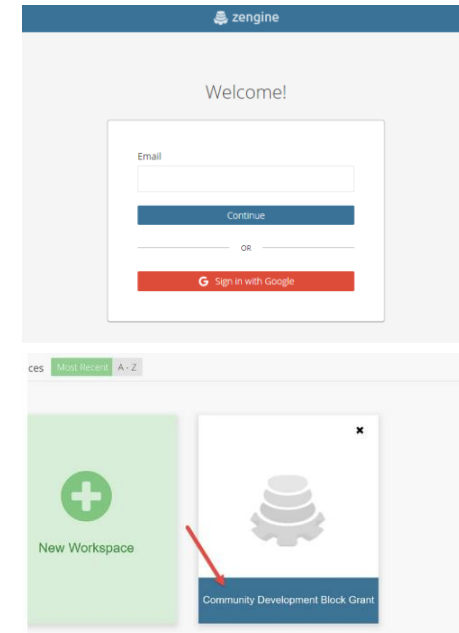
For Applicants/Subrecipients

# Integration with RIFANS and RIGID

## RIFANS

- Rhode Island Financial System
- Subaward invoices/payments are collected in eCivis and paid through RIFANS

## RIGID

- Rhode Island Grant ID
- Automated by eCivis to connect them to RIFANS

- Upcoming RIGID Updates: We recognize the RIGID is complex and are working with the vendor to change it to a more meaningful identifier as part of the upcoming Workday ERP project.

# Grants.gov

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- Where you apply for grants
- eCivis centralizes grants from across federal agencies and integrates them into eCivis – One stop shop!
- Search for grants on eCivis – then be directed to the appropriate place to apply on grants.gov
- You can save grants you are going to apply for as "projects" in eCivis, or email grants you find to others directly from eCivis.

# Regulations

## Uniform Grant Guidance

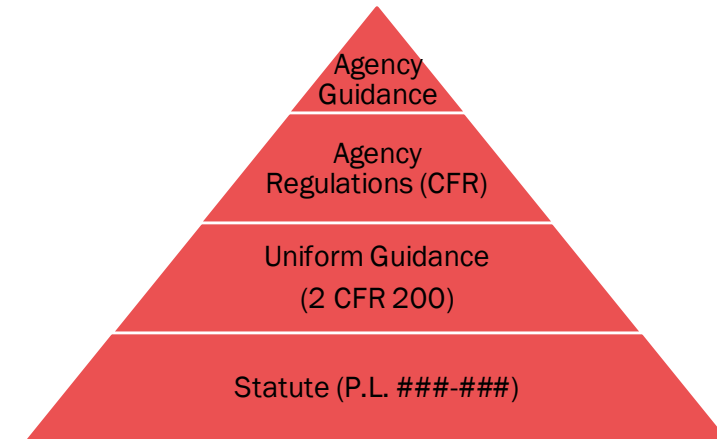
- Implemented December 26, 2014
- Set of rules and regulations on federal grants from the Office of Management and Budget – Establishes uniform administrative requirements, cost principals, and audit requirements for Federal award to non-Federal entities

## State Regulations

- Effective: 3/15/2023
- Establishes a regulatory framework for grant-making by state agencies involving federal funds that is consistent with 2 CRF 200
- Promote fairness and consistency, expand transparency and access, and remove barriers for grant seekers
- Implemented GMS 😎

- Awarding Agency: Federal Grantor
- Award Amount: Total amount of grant award
- Match/Cost Share: Is the state required to provide funds in addition to the federal award?
- UEI: Unique Entity Identifier
- FAIN: Federal Award Identification Number
- Assistance Listing Number (Formally CFDA)
- Period of Performance: Length of grant program
- Program description



# Type of Expenditures

If allowed by the terms and conditions of the Federal Award, grant funds can be used for a wide range of expenditures in state government including:

- Personnel
- Subawards
- Goods/Services
- Centralized Services
- Supplies (WB Mason etc)



# Upcoming Enhancements

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## Application and Review Management

- New platform through eCivis for Grantors to create, review, and manage applications for subrecipients
- Allows multiple people to work on application collaboratively
- General system and user enhancements
- Collaborated with grant staff and the vendor for these improvements
  - Enhancements based off feedback from users

# Where to Start

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- What is your role in the grant lifecycle?
- Program? Finance? Subaward?
  - Does your agency have central finance office?
  - Does your agency have any GMS policies/procedures?

# Glossary of Terms

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- GMO: Grants Management Office
- GMS: Grants Management System (eCivis is Rhode Island's GMS)
- Subrecipient: Entity receiving funds from a state agency (i.e. non-profit, municipality etc.)
  - State agency applies for grant from Federal Government – When state agency is awarded they can then subaward out to "subrecipients" all or part of their award
- RIFANS: Rhode Island financial system for tracking expenditures
- Grant Lifecycle: Refers from grant from start to finish. Typically is four stages (Pre-award, awarded, and post award, closeout)
- 2CFR 200 – Uniform Grant Guidance = attempt at consistent grant requirements across federal agencies
- Competitive vs Formula Awards: Competitive awards require applications and formula awards are granted automatically by federal government
- Assistance Listing Number: Grant program identifier; Each federal grant program gets a ALN (formally CFDA)
- Federal Award Identification Number (FAIN): Grant award identifier/award ID
  - FAIN's are specific to the individual award for each state agency, ALN is for the grant program overall

# Glossary of Terms cont.

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- Grantee: Entity receiving grant funds
- Grantor: Entity giving grant funds
- Subaward: Document issued by state to subrecipient with grant details, terms and conditions
- UEI: Unique Entity Identifier
  - Generated in SAM.gov for registered entities – Agencies and subrecipients are required to register with SAM.gov and have a UEI to get grant funding
- Line Sequence: State account where expenditures are charged and revenue is recorded
- RIGID: Rhode Island Grant ID – How we connect eCivis and RIFANS together
  - Currently a combination of agency number, line sequence, and eCivis "RIGID"
- NOFO: Notice of Funding Opportunity
- NOA: Notice of Award aka. grant agreement (from federal agency you requested grant money from)
